

MOUNT SCIO

The District of Mount Scio shall consist of and include all that part of the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador bounded as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of the centre line of Thorburn Road and the centre line of the Trans-Canada Highway, also known as the Outer Ring Road;

Thence running in a general northwesterly direction along the centre line of Thorburn Road to its intersection with the City of St. John's Municipal Boundary (1998);

Thence running in a general westerly, southwesterly and easterly direction along the said Municipal Boundary to its intersection with the centre line of the Trans-Canada Highway, also known as the Outer Ring Road;

Thence running in a general southerly direction along the centre line of the Trans-Canada Highway to its intersection with the centre line of Kenmount Road;

Thence running in a general northeasterly direction along the centre line of Kenmount Road to its intersection with the centre line of Columbus Drive;

Thence running in a general southerly direction along the centre line of Columbus Drive to its intersection with the centre line of Old Pennywell Road;

Thence running in a general northeasterly direction along the centre line of Old Pennywell Road to its intersection with the centre line of Empire Avenue;

Thence running in a general northeasterly direction along the centre line of Empire Avenue to its intersection with the centre line of Mayor Avenue;

Thence running in a general northwesterly direction along the centre line of Mayor Avenue to its intersection with the centre line of Bonaventure Avenue;

Thence running in a general northwesterly direction along the centre line of Bonaventure Avenue to its intersection with the centre line of Allandale Road;

Thence running in a general northerly and westerly direction along the centre line of Allandale Road to its intersection with the centre line of the Trans-Canada Highway, also known as the Outer Ring Road;

Thence running in a general southwesterly direction along the centre line of the Trans-Canada Highway to the point of beginning.

Note: This District includes part of the Town of Paradise and part of the City of St. John's.
